



Late Shreemanji K N VASUDEVAN

Our divine guiding light

Late Shreemanji K N VASUDEVAN (1935-2021)

FOUNDER PRINCIPAL, FOUNDER DIRECTOR

Born in 1935 at Kodungallur, Kerala, he graduated from Madras University and completed his post-graduation in Zoology from Bihar University, where he was a rank holder. He began his illustrious career in education as a teacher at Netarhat Vidyalaya in 1960 and served the institution until his retirement as Principal in 1995. In 1968, he topped the Summer Institute of Biology and was awarded the prestigious Fulbright Scholarship, which allowed him to collaborate with Texas University in Houston and DePaul University in Chicago. He was also selected for the Summer Science Research Project at Oklahoma University, further expanding his expertise in the field.

Throughout his career, he was actively involved in several summer institutes across India as a resource person and was associated with SCERT and NCERT as a subject expert in Biology. Additionally, he contributed as a text-book reviewer for various educational boards. His commitment to education extended beyond the classroom, and in 1962, he was commissioned as an NCC Naval Officer after training at INS Venduruthy in Cochin. For 19 years, he served as a Naval Wing Officer at Netarhat Vidyalaya, retiring as Chief Officer.

His excellence as an educator earned him the President's Award for Best Teacher in 1993, followed by recognition from Bihar Pradesh Congress as the Best Teacher in 1996. In 2005, the Nehru Yuva Kendra, under the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports, Government of India, honored him for his outstanding contributions to education and community service on the occasion of Teacher's Day.

After retiring from Netarhat, he took on the role of Founder Principal at Vidya Vihar Residential School, Purnea. His vision and leadership later saw him become the Director of Vidya Vihar, where he continued to guide the institution towards excellence in education.

RATNESHWAR MISHRA

HONOURABLE PROF. (DR.) RATNESHWAR MISHRA CHAIRMAN

Born on December 1, 1945, in Bishnupur, Purnea, Prof. (Dr.) Ratneshwar Mishra received his early education at Netarhat School and pursued higher studies at Patna University. He began his career as a History Lecturer at S.P. College, Dumka (1967–1973) and later served at C.M. College, Darbhanga (1974–1975) before joining L.N. Mithila University, where he eventually became Professor and Head of the History Department, retiring in 2005.

Prof. Mishra's achievements include presiding over the "Countries Other Than India" section at the Indian History Congress (2006) and holding key positions in L.N. Mithila University's governance bodies. He has authored numerous history books, contributed research papers to leading journals, and served on the Sahitya Akademi's Advisory Committee (Maithili) from 2002 to 2007. In 2018, the Ministry of HRD appointed him to a committee for preserving the Maithili script.

Currently, Prof. Mishra is the Chairman of Vidya Vihar Residential School, where his leadership fosters academic excellence and cultural preservation, inspiring future generations of scholars.

Er. Ranjit Kumar Paul, originally from Jamtara, Jharkhand, completed his higher secondary education at Netarhat Vidyalaya in 1960 as part of the first batch. He earned a Bachelor's degree in Metallurgy from BIT Sindri and pursued postgraduate studies in Industrial Engineering, along with a management course at ISM Dhanbad.

Er. Paul's distinguished career spanned key roles in organizations like Bhilai Steel Plant, Bharat Coking Coal Ltd., Coal India, and Bharat Bhari Udyog Nigam Ltd. (BBUNL). His expertise in HRD within the coal industry earned him a nomination to the "Training for Overseas Managers" program in the UK in 1984. Before retiring, he held senior positions as Chief General Manager at Coal India and Executive Director at BBUNL, Kolkata.

A life member of MGMI, ISTD, and NIPM, Er. Paul has actively contributed to the professional community through seminars and conferences at national and international levels.

Since 2009, he has been with Vidya Vihar Residential School, initially as Joint Director and now as Director, guiding the institution toward academic excellence and holistic development, equipping students to face future challenges with competence and confidence.

TOWARDS ACHIEVING AIMS AND OBJECTIVES OF EDUCATION

In 1954, the Government of Bihar established Netarhat Vidyalaya with the vision of promoting educational excellence. This pioneering initiative not only achieved academic success but also shaped generations of students by blending traditional Indian values with modern scientific thought. Inspired by the remarkable impact of Netarhat, its alumni and former teachers envisioned a similar institution that could extend this spirit further, adapting it to modern educational needs.

Vidya Vihar Residential School (VVRS), located at Parora, Purnea, was founded to carry forward this legacy with certain modifications in curriculum and medium of instruction, aligning with contemporary educational standards. The goal is to foster holistic development while maintaining the core principles of the Netarhat model.

At VVRS, we welcome both male and female students from across India and abroad, with a primary objective to nurture their potential in all aspects of life. Our mission goes beyond academic excellence: we focus on shaping students into well-rounded individuals with integrated personalities, quided by values such as fraternity, equality, and justice.

The school provides a stimulating environment where students are encouraged to explore scientific knowledge from an early stage. A well-stocked library and comprehensive computer education promote a scientific mindset and curiosity. Learning at VVRS transcends traditional instruction, involving diverse activities that inspire inquiry, creativity, and independent thought.

Our carefully designed curricular and co-curricular activities foster moral values, social responsibility, physical fitness, and creativity. Initially an all-boys school, VVRS expanded to admit female students in classes 6th, 7th, 8th, and 1lth. This decision was driven by growing demand from parents and guardians for quality boarding education for girls. With this change, VVRS continues its commitment to providing a nurturing, inclusive, and value-based educational environment for all.





SCHOOL AND MANAGEMENT

Vidya Vihar Residential School is a fully residential school for boys from standard IV to XII and for girls six & onwards. It was the first ISO 9001 certified school of Bihar. The school campus is spread over an estate of 41 Acres in a pollution free, calm and lush green atmosphere conducive to learning and free-thinking. The school building and various other facilities have been developed well beyond the guidelines of CBSE, New Delhi. These consist of School Building, Hostels, Mess, Administrative Block, Guest House, Health Care Centre, Staff Quarters & Auditorium. Sufficient facilities have been created for a rich Library, state of the art Laboratories, ATL, Space Lab, Indoor Sports Hall, Outdoor and Indoor Games, Open Air Theatre, Art & Music, Water Supply and Electricity. The school is absolutely cosmopolitan in its outlook and extends the services on the line of a public school and provides a comprehensive and liberal education for children of all communities and states.

LOCATION

The School is situated at Parora on Purnea-Dhamdaha main road at a distance of 10 Kms. from Purnea bus stand and 15 Kms from Purnea railway station. Purnea is also linked with Katihar (a major rail head on Barauni-Guwahati section) by broad-gauge. Regular bus service is available between Purnea and Parora. Tourist resort of Kajha Kothi is 4 Kms. from the location of the school.

About VVRSACADEMIC SESSION



SYSTEM OF EDUCATION, CURRICULUM, MEDIUM OF INSTRUCTION

The school is affiliated to Central Board of Secondary Education, New Delhi. The school Code is 65060 and the affiliation no. is 330061. The Medium of instruction and that of communication on the campus is English. Special care is taken in the teaching of English at different levels, emphasizing the interactive skills of the students in the language. However, there is emphasis on achieving a high standard in Hindi and Sanskrit as well.

The School session commences in April and ends in March next.





FACULTY

An excellent team of dedicated and qualified teachers drawn from all over India form the core of our faculty. Besides, Ex-teachers and old alumni of Netarhat School excelling in educational field have given consent to come to the School to guide and teach students as 'Visiting Teachers'.

COMPUTER EDUCATION

Keeping in view the strides made in Information Technology, every effort is made to impart Information Technology training to the students from class IV onwards. The computer network of the school helps the children gain latest knowledge in computers. The centre serves as an Online encyclopedia, serving the inquisitive needs of both the students and teachers.

FINE ARTS AND MUSIC

Music and Art Education is compulsory for the students from class IV to VIII. Besides, drawing, they are taught water- colour and oil painting etc. Depending upon their interest and talent. Classes in vocal music, instrumental music and classical dance are arranged for artistically interested students.

YOGA

Yoga is compulsory for all students. Mass yoga is practised once every week during PT period.



















GAMES AND PHYSICAL EDUCATION

The school offers manifold training in the physical activities to the realization of the amateur's dreams and for the enrichment of their hidden talents. Physical Education is on the curriculum and special coaching after school hours is held during the games for Football, Cricket, Volleyball, Handball, Basketball, Badminton, Chess, Table Tennis, Kho Kho, Kabaddi & Athletics. Games and PT are compulsory for all students. Necessary play grounds are available in the School campus. In addition, we have constructed a modern cricket stadium equipped with state-of-the-art amenities. The cricket ground is encircled by athletic tracks, providing a comprehensive facility for both cricket and track sports.

LIBRARY

The school has two well-stocked libraries. Sufficient number of books, periodicals, newspapers and magazines are provided to help students cultivate reading habit and to become updated in respect of information and knowledge. Students are encouraged to borrow books to read in their spare time besides allotted library period in the school routine. Carefully chosen books on all subjects and for all levels charismatically silence the students and teachers and slide them into deep thought.





SECURITY

To ensure the security of pupil, identity cards are issued to Parents/Guardians. The security guards permit only the card-holders to enter the campus and meet their wards. Visitors may go around the campus with the permission of the Principal /Director only.

TRAINING IN LEADERSHIP

Students' participation in school management is encouraged and they are expected to shoulder responsibilities by holding various assignments in Class, Mess and Houses. It helps the students to develop self-confidence and leadership qualities for their future endeavours. **NCC**, **Scouts**, **Guides**, **Drills and camps also contribute for the same.**

CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

For all-round development of students' supplementary education in an organized manner is imparted through activities. On Saturdays various activities such as cultural programmes, literary activities, quiz, movies etc are arranged in order to develop inborn qualities, and inculcate affinity to cultural milieu of our national life.

HOSTELS (HOUSES)

There are twenty three houses namely Renu, Dinkar, Bose, Aryabhatt, Rajendra, Kautilya, Raman, Vivekanand, Ramkrishna, Nehru, Shastri, Tagore, Gautam, Mahaveer, GuruGovind, Nalanda, Vikramshila, Takshashila, Gargi, Maitreyi, Bharti, Mahashweta and Subhadra accommodating about 1250 students.

Each house is under the charge of a Housemaster who is directly involved in looking after the day-to-day affairs of their houses. Houses are well designed to make the students feel comfortable. Housemaster's residence is attached to the hostel. Efforts are made by the Housemasters to make boys or girls share some responsibilities related to their House.

MORNING AND EVENING ASSEMBLY

Morning Assembly starts with prayer and students are encouraged to deliver talks on various topics. Daily news and thought are read out by students in turn. Evening Assembly also starts with a prayer, followed by meditation and Evening Self Study.

PHONE CALLS

The school provides Smart Card based Guardian call facility to every student.

Students are permitted to contact their Parents/Guardians twice in a month on a specific day as per the given time schedule.

A talk time of 50 minutes per month is permitted





HEALTH CARE CENTRE

Health Care Centre on the campus looks after the health of the students. A Resident Medical Officer and two qualified compounders look after the medical needs. Specialized consultation is also available. Health check-ups and medical consultation are free of cost. Students are advised to approach health care centre in case they are facing any medical problem.

In an emergency and on medical advice, the Director/Principal/House Master sign the form of consent for the administration of anesthesia or performance of any operation on the ailing student on behalf of the parents without accepting any liability. Inoculation and vaccination and other prophylactic measures are administered to the students as per advice of Medical Officer, on instructions received from parents. Medical leave is granted to students only on the recommendation of the School Medical Officer.

SELF-STUDY

Apart from the teaching schedule of the school, there are supervised self-study periods in the Classrooms/Hostels during afternoons and evenings. There is no self-study period on Saturday evenings.

EXAMINATION & EVALUATION

The school encourages regular study by every student and promotion to higher classes depends upon the successful performance in the examination, spread over the whole academic year as per CBSE Curriculum.

COUNSELLING AND GUIDANCE

The counseling care is also available to address the emotional, social and behavioral needs of the students. And to create a seamless and friendly environment to help each one of them with different approaches.

Progress report of every student is sent to the parents/ guardians giving details of the marks obtained in each subject.



Admission Process





The prospectus can be obtained from designated sales centers for ₹500. Registration can be done by payment of ₹1000 with filled application.

Alternatively, applicants can visit https://admission.vvrs.org/ to complete the online form, with a total application fee of ₹1,500, which includes both registration and prospectus charges. All forms and required materials must be submitted by January 15th to be eligible for the admission test, which is conducted every January.

Admission Process

The admission process in Classes 4 to 8 and 11 in Vidya Vihar Residential School involves a written test scheduled for 3rd Sunday of January (upcoming test: Sunday, 19th January 2025), at 11:00 AM, conducted at three centers:

- A) PURNEA Vidya Vihar Residential School, Parora, Purnea
- B) Darbhanga Zakir Hussain College, Darbhanga
- C) PATNA A N College, Patna

Guardians are required to collect the admit card from the Center Superintendent one hour before the test begins. The exam will last for two/three hours, covering subjects from the CBSE syllabus of the preceding class for which admission is sought.

The subjects included are English, Hindi, Mathematics, Sanskrit, Science, Social Science/Environmental Science, General Knowledge, and Mental Ability.

Question booklets will be in English, and students must write their answers in English, except for the Hindi and Sanskrit language section. The test will feature a mix of short answer questions, multiple-choice questions, fill-in-the-blanks, and short essays. The relevant syllabus can be obtained from website.

Students who clear the written exam will proceed to an interview and medical examination held at Vidya Vihar Residential School, Parora (Purnea). Parents or guardians must accompany the student to the interview and be prepared to complete all admission formalities, including paying the first semester fees and charges, on the spot. The results of the written test will be declared within a week and will be available via phone at 8448448720 / 9204068907 / 7979062808. Selected candidates will also receive updates about the interview date and related matters through SMS or WhatsApp. The final results will be announced the day after the interviews conclude.

Admission is contingent upon the student being declared medically fit by the school's medical board. The Chairman of the Selection Committee will make the final decision regarding admissions, following the selection process.

These certificates will be retained by the school for official records. The date of birth recorded in the school's admission register will be considered final and cannot be modified at any stage.

In addition to the above, the following documents are also required, duly filled and completed:

- Confidential Report (to be filled by the previous school or relevant authority).
- Medical History Form detailing the student's health background.
- Agreement on a ₹100 Non-judicial stamp paper (signed by the parent/guardian).
- Declaration Form confirming acceptance of school rules and policies.
- Authorization for Local Guardian and Escort: Two passport-sized, colored photos (one of the local guardian and one of the escort for identification purposes).
- Two recent passport-sized, colored photos of the student for the school's records.

School Rules

Vidya Vihar Residential School offers multiple vacation periods throughout the academic year, including Summer Vacation, Puja Vacation, Winter Vacation, and a Session Break for Old Batches. These vacations are subject to adjustments based on prevailing circumstances, and the specific dates will be communicated in advance.

Beyond the scheduled vacations, students are allowed up to six days of personal leave annually for unavoidable circumstances, festivals, or other valid reasons, subject to approval by the Director or Principal. Guardians are encouraged to plan such leaves early in the academic year to avoid disruptions to their child's schedule.

Guardians must collect their children personally before vacations. If they are unable to do so, a representative with a signed authorization letter from the guardian must accompany the student at the time of departure. To reduce the need to carry personal belongings home, the school provides a secure Cloak Room facility in each house, where students can safely store their items during long breaks.

Attendance on the final day before vacation begins and on the first day of the new term is compulsory. Absence on these critical days will be treated as a serious disciplinary breach. Failure to report on the first day of the term or non-payment of fees according to the fee schedule may result in the student's removal from the school rolls. Leave requests for absence on the first day will only be considered if the term fee is paid on time, and the reason for absence is deemed valid by the school administration.







MEDICAL CARE RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. Reporting Illness: Students must report any illness to their Housemasters, who will refer them to the school's Medical Officer for care.
- 2. Medicine Procurement: Medicines will be provided by the school, with the cost deducted from the student's pocket money deposit.
- 3. Parental Communication: Parents are notified only for significant health issues. Minor ailments are managed without informing parents unless necessary. Students are expected to communicate any change in their health status to their parents/guardians on their own.
- 4. Spare Spectacles: Students wearing spectacles must carry a spare pair and prescription.
- 5. Handling Contagious Illness: Students with contagious illnesses (e.g., measles, mumps) will be sent home for recovery. Re-joining requires a fitness certificate and approval from the school's Medical Officer. Guardians with contagious diseases are advised not to visit the school to ensure community health.





WITHDRAWALS

If a parent/guardian wishes to withdraw his/her ward, he/she must give a minimum one-month's notice to the school in writing. The parents are required to collect all the belongings of their ward at the time of leaving the school campus after receipt of the school-leaving certificate. The school will not be responsible for any leftover belongings.

HOSTEL/ HOUSE RULES AND REGULATION

School Rules

- 1. Daily Routine Compliance: Boarders must follow the house and school routines unless medically exempted by the Medical Officer, Principal, Director, or Joint Director.
- 2. Attendance in Activities: Attendance during PT, games, and school hours is mandatory, except with prior approval from the Principal or Director.
- 3. Prohibited Items: Students are not allowed to keep cash, electrical appliances, wristwatches, or electronic gadgets.
- 4. Communication: Phone contact with parents/guardians is allowed twice a month using a school-provided smart calling card.
- 5. Service Requests: Barber, cobbler, washerman, and tailor services are accessible through Service Request Slips.
- 6. Enrollment Conditions: Continuation as a boarder requires meeting academic, health, behavioral, and payment standards set by the school.
- 7. Management Discretion: These guidelines are subject to the school management's discretion in their interpretation and application.





REMOVAL FROM THE HOSTEL/SCHOOL

A student may be expelled if their behavior negatively influences others or if they fail to improve conduct that disrupts the academic environment. Additionally, parents/guardians will be asked to withdraw students whose performance does not meet the school's prescribed standards.

Re-admission will not be granted if a student fails in the Board exam, in accordance with CBSE guidelines; such students can only appear as private candidates.

In all cases of withdrawal or expulsion, hostel charges paid for the entire semester will be forfeited, except for unused mess fees. School fees will be refunded on a pro-rata basis following CBSE norms. No requests for refunds will be entertained beyond these terms.

LEAVE REGULATIONS

Students are generally not permitted to leave during the term, with exceptions allowed for the following:

- 1. Medical Leave: Granted based on the Medical Officer's recommendation or discretion of the Principal, Director, or Joint Director.
- 2. Family Weddings: Up to three days (excluding travel) may be granted for weddings of close relatives (sibling or first cousin), with an invitation card attached to the leave application. Leave is not granted during exams or camps.
- 3. Upanayan Ceremony: Families are encouraged to conduct it during vacations. If unavoidable, up to six days (excluding travel) may be granted.
- **4.** Emergency Leave: Permitted for emergencies like a parent's illness or a family member's death.

All leave requests must be submitted to the Principal, Director, or Joint Director. Students must return on the specified date; delays due to illness require immediate notification and a fitness certificate upon return. Reporting on the first day after vacations and attending the first assembly of the session/semester is mandatory to avoid penalties.

SCHOOL REGULATIONS

- 1. Compliance with Rules: Parents and guardians must follow school rules, subject to updates, with final decisions resting with the Principal/-Director.
- 2. Authority Delegation: School staff, under the Principal/Director, may make decisions during tours, treks, camps, and emergencies on behalf of students.

- 7. Transfer Certificate (TC): Students must clear belongings when leaving; unclaimed items are not the school's responsibility.
- 8. Disciplinary Removal: Students may be removed for misconduct or failing academic standards.
- 9. English Communication: Students must converse in English on campus to enhance fluency.
- 10. Conduct and Property: Vandalism, indecent behavior, or theft will result in disciplinary action or suspension.
- 11. Personal Responsibility: Students are accountable for safeguarding their belongings.
- **12.** No Groupism or Fighting: Fighting or group activities that disrupt school harmony will lead to suspension or expulsion.
- **13.** No Cheating: Cheating will result in a zero and potential expulsion.
- 14. Restricted Food Items: Only limited dry fruits (up to 1 kg) are allowed in hostels; other outside food is prohibited.
- 15. Permission to Leave Campus: Students require approval from the Director/Principal to leave and must notify their Housemaster.
- 16. Visitor Policy: Only authorized visitors are allowed, limited to the second Sunday each month. Approved Reading Material: Only books and
- **17.** magazines approved by school authorities are allowed.
- **18.** Reasons for Removal: Grounds for dismissal include: Dishonesty or immoral behavior; Severe insubordination; Non-payment of fees; Consistent academic underperformance; Violence, bullying, or harassment; Property damage
- 19. Hostel and School Dismissal: Expulsion from the hostel results in dismissal from the school.
- 20. No Valuables: Students should not possess money, jewelry, or electronics; the school is not responsible for losses.
- 21. Labeling Belongings: All belongings must be marked with the student's roll number to avoid loss.
- 22. Anti-Bullying Policy: Bullying or teasing will result in immediate expulsion







PARENTS / GUARDIANS' VISITS

- 1. Initial Visit for New Students: Guardians of newly admitted students may visit one month after admission, on the second Sunday of May.
- 2. Scheduled Visits: Visits are permitted only on specific days announced by the school, from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. and 2:30 p.m. to 5:00 p.m., at designated locations.
- **3.** Restricted Hours: Visits on weekdays during school hours are not allowed.
- 4. Hostel Visits Before Admission: Parents/guardians may inspect hostels during vacation/break when no student is in campus.
- 5. Meetings with Principal/Director: Meetings are allowed on visit days or with prior permission on any working day from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m., to discuss matters concerning their ward or general school affairs.

RESIDUARY

The school management reserves the right to modify or amend any rules outlined in the prospectus at its discretion, and such changes will be binding on parents, guardians, and students. Additionally, all stakeholders are expected to comply with the rules and policies implemented by the school from time to time. Examination and vacation schedules may be adjusted as needed, with the school prioritizing the best interests of students and the institution.

OFFICE HOURS

The following are the office hours on the working days/second Sundays for depositing fees /other official assignments- 9:30 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. and 2:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m.

MEETING WITH THE HOUSE MASTERS / TEACHERS

The parents/Guardians who wish to meet the House Masters /Teachers may contact the office. The office will arrange the meeting with the teachers and House Masters on holidays. On day of visit, this can only be done if a teacher is free.

CAR PARKING

On entering the School campus, the parents/guardians/visitors must enter their particulars in the Gate Register and then park their vehicles in the Car Park areas.

DINING

Meals can be arranged for the parents and guardians at the school mess, provided a request is made to the Principal/Director well in advance or latest by 11:30 am. For this purpose coupons are available with the office. The cost of the meals will be realized from the pocket money deposit of the student concerned.

OBJECTIVE: MISSION IIT/NEET/CA POSSIBLE PROBLEM WITH REGULAR COACHING SETUP

- 1. Coaching and +2 level schools are rarely integrated. The distance between school/college and coaching institute greatly afffects the quality of preparation. For Instance, in Patna, schools/colleges are in Mahendru area coaching institutes are in Kankarbagh, Boring road area. In Delhi, schools/colleges may be in R K Puram/Uttam Nagar while coaching institutes are in Hauz Khas. Same phenomenon is observed at Ranchi, Bokaro, Kota, Varanasi and many such others places.
- 2. Distance between school/college and coaching institute takes away valuable time of aspirants. Commuting between school/college and coaching institute is very hectic for students. In other words, it lays extra burden on aspirants.
- 3. In above situation, aspirants feel very exhausted throughout the day. So they cannot give 100% efforts on self study which is very important to assimilate and absorb the concepts taught in the coaching sessions.
- 4. The curriculum of schools and coaching are not coordinated (both in content and pace). For example, while at a certain time if thermodynamics is being handled at School, the coaching is handling optics. In this scenario, aspirants will not be able to concentrate on either of the topics. At the end of the day, aspirants manage to gain only half-baked knowledge on both the topics
- 5. During survey, students lamented the low emphasis given to basics. Tutors tend to jump directly to advanced problems after dealing with only a couple of basic ones. This adversely affects the concept building process of aspirants. Schools think that detailed study is to be done only in coaching institutes. Ultimately students suffer from both sides.
- 6. In coaching there are number of batches formed and aspirant teacher ratio is very high (about 200:1) So these institutes lack in personal attention to aspirants. Thus, individual doubts are rarely handled or eliminated.
- 7. Initially, when an aspirant joins any coaching, his expectations are pretty high in terms of study, attention etc. After a span of time when he faces this grim reality, he/she gets disappointed. But alas precious time has already been lost. His Career Goals remain unattained.
- 8. Parents are not made aware of the regular progress of aspirant because there is no open feed back system in present school/coaching education system.
- 9. It is practically not possible for an aspirant to buy all foreign publications books for preparation. Hence, one has to remain contented with local publications
- 10. Inaccessibility to a laboratory during preparation is another important issue. We know that laboratory plays an important role in understanding concepts. If an aspirant goes through practical learning process, his efficiency improves. In absence of lab work, rote learning (remembering and mugging of subject) doesn't help much.
- 11. Environment plays an important role in making valued aspirants.
- (A) When an aspirant goes to any metro/mega city for preparation, there are chances to fall for many bad habits like smoking, chewing tobacco, drinking, pornography, movie mania etc. in absence of proper guidance.
- (B) Non-availablity of hygienic & nutritious diet leads to many health problems, normally jaundice, typhoid.
- (C) Unlike minded people in the vicinity creates disturbance for aspirants.

After much analysis of problems with existing set-up of advanced classes system, we have PUT IN PLACE a system in Vidya Vihar which will help student in :- cracking JEE (Main/Advanced)/NEET etc.

- 1. An integrated system in which schooling and extra classes facility will be in the same campus to avoid waste of time & exhaustion caused by travel.
- 2. Daily plan that will ease out the pressure on the time for the student unlocking lots of extra time required for self studies
- 3. Top-notch faculty from strong academic background with experience in effective JEE/NEET/CA advanced education system




